


Trend Indicator of Output

2018, June

National economy grew in June from the previous year, decrease from the month before


Seasonally adjusted output fell by 0.3 per cent in June 2018 from the month before. In June, working-day adjusted output was 3.0 per cent higher than one year before. According to revised data, working-day adjusted output rose in May 2018 by 3.5 per cent (previously 3.4 per cent) from May 2017.

Volume of total output 2005 to 2018, trend and seasonally adjusted series



The series of the Trend Indicator of Output are seasonally adjusted with the Tramo/Seats method. The latest observations of the series adjusted for seasonal and random variation (seasonally adjusted and trend series) become revised with new observations in seasonal adjustment methods. Revisions especially at turning points of economic trends may be significant, which should be taken into consideration when using seasonally adjusted and trend data.

Working day adjusted change of total output from previous year's corresponding month, %



Working day adjusted primary production went up by around 10 per cent, secondary production by good one per cent and services by slightly over four per cent from June 2017.

Primary production refers to agriculture, hunting, forestry and fishing. Secondary production includes manufacturing and construction. Services comprise trade, hotel and restaurant activities, transport and business activities, as well as real estate, renting and research services, financial intermediation and insurance, and public services.

GDP and employment are estimated to have grown in the second quarter of 2018

Seasonally adjusted GDP is estimated to have risen by 0.5 per cent from the previous quarter. According to the series adjusted for working days, GDP was 2.9 per cent up on the corresponding quarter of the year before. It is estimated that the number of the employed has increased by around two per cent from one year ago. Adjusted for working days, the number of hours worked was three per cent higher than in the same quarter of one year ago.

The data are based on preliminary data of the Trend Indicator of Output. The next <u>quarterly national accounts</u> with more detailed data will be published on 31 August 2018.

Intermediate consumption, as well as taxes and subsidies on products are not estimated in the compilation of the quarterly flash estimate, but quarterly GDP is carried forward with a change based on the data of the Trend Indicator of Output.
